Justification

The world of scouting is currently thriving. We have observed a significant increase in recent years, due to the growing importance that clubs place on identifying and evaluating talent. It is estimated that there are now thousands of professionals dedicated to scouting around the world, working in elite clubs, lower divisions, and youth academies.

The role of the scout is essential for any competitive football team. A scout is dedicated to observing and analyzing players and teams, gathering crucial information for coaches and sports directors. This analysis can include evaluating potential signings, studying future opponents, and monitoring players loaned to other teams.

Scouts impact all levels and scales of football, from lower divisions to elite clubs. They are key in player movement, facilitating transitions between categories and ensuring that teams have a competitive and balanced lineup. Understanding what a scout does and the scouting methodologies used by top-tier teams like FC Barcelona allows those

interested in professionalizing in this field to learn from the best and achieve optimal results.

The aim of this program is to introduce students to the world of scouting in football. Throughout the course, students will learn:

- What scouting is and the phases of the player recruitment process.
- How to plan scouting based on different contexts.
- Techniques to evaluate players and prepare detailed reports.
