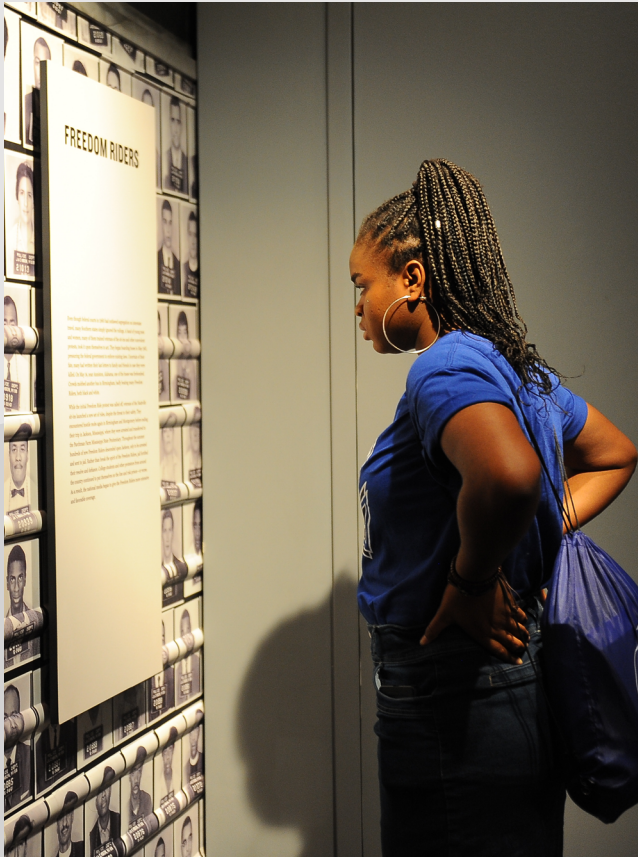

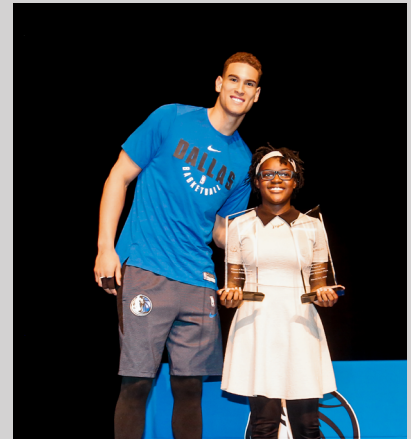


College Send Off Celebrations
